
Poland has joined FIRS-RAD races in June 2015, making their debut in Jirkov (CZE). Since then, the discipline in Poland has been growing with great dynamics. In 2016 we organized first WR race, and last June first World Cup Race held in Poland. The experience and international feedback gained from both events gave us confidence that we are ready to organize a World Cup race in 2018, which will meet your demands as closely as possible.

As recently, we would like to conduct the race on Agrykola street, a magical, one of longest track ever. Beautiful surrounding, the center of Warsaw are another reasons to come to Poland.



We are sure, that Warsaw – a big city in a heart of eastern Europe – is a great destination for inline alpine racers. It provides a convenient connection (direct plane transfer), possibility of visiting the capital of Poland, with moving history, and a chance to stay in Warsaw citizens' hearts forever.

For us, polish athletes and organizers, as well as for FIRS-RAD, conducting main races in big cities gives biggest impulse for making our sport more popular. We are sure, that this inline spot meets these criteria.



- Inclination: ~7%
- Altitude difference: 22m

- Asphalt quality: very good
- Ramp: over 1,5 m.



Long, wide track with even inclination.

Excellent asphalt (very good grip) and very safe finish (long, wide and flat) promises great show

The spot is a canyon, which makes it a natural amphitheater with good visibility and acoustics.

For athletes from Warsaw it is a main training track.



- Promising organizer's World Cup debut (WC in 2017: 9 countries, over 130 racers)
- Very dynamic discipline growth (several new clubs joining, lots of polish racers expected)
- Good, safe track in the heart of the capital of Poland, referring to the essence of inline alpine (city event)



Improvements:

- plastic fences
- time measurement (wire + wireless as a second measurement)
- better sound in the athletes zone
- live streaming
