The Inline Slalom European Championships is a highlight on the World Skate Europe Inline Slalom calendar.

The purpose of this manual is to outline basic requirements for clubs / entities interested in hosting the Inline Slalom European Championships and to provide guidelines to the Organizer to help them with the planning to host a successful event.

The Inline Slalom European Championships is owned and controlled by World Skate Europe (WSE) and all media, commercial and marketing rights are exclusively owned by WSE or an entity designated by WSE. WSE may release some of those rights to the host club / entity for a fee to be determined through negotiations between the two parties.

The key objectives of the Inline Slalom European Championships are:

- To provide the best conditions for all the athletes participating
- To ensure that the event is reported and promoted as extensively as possible by the different media
- To maximize the number of spectators at the event and provide them with a pleasing experience
- To ensure that the event is a success from a financial aspect and that all parties are satisfied with the results
- To promote Inline Slalom throughout Europe



1. GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE CHAMPIONSHIP EVENT

The Inline Slalom European Championships (henceforth “Championships”) are the most important European event for this discipline.

These Championships will have a ceremonial, protocol but also a spectacular character and will be promoted through national and international broadcasting, streaming TV on the official website of World Skate Europe, as well as on social networks and new communication media.

Though maintaining a markedly sporting character based on World Skate regulations, the Championships wish to combine the pure sports competition with a festive atmosphere of unity among athletes of all nationalities.

During the implementation of the Championships any side activities for the promotion of Roller Sports will be agreed with the Host.

The Championships are open to all the national teams of the Federations, which are members of the World Skate, who have regularly paid their fees and have given confirmation of their participation according to the terms established.

All the skaters must be member of their national Federation and must be covered by a federal or personal insurance. Only athletes who have “Active” status are allowed to take part in Championships.

2. RULES AND RULEBOOK

The Championships must be organized in accordance with the technical information within the Inline Slalom World Skate Rulebook.

Henceforth, information on (2.1) disciplines, (2.2) age categories, start authorization and awards as well as on (2.3) organizational rules is specified.

2.1 DISCIPLINES

In reference to the Inline Slalom World Skate rulebook the disciplines for the European Championships are as follows:

- Inline Slalom
- Inline Giant Slalom
- Inline Parallel Slalom
- Inline Slalom Team Race (one team per nation)
- Team Race Giant Slalom (one team per nation)
- Inline Slalom Combined Race

Recommendation: The organizing nation / club should make it possible that several disciplines per age group can be held during one race event.

2.2 AGE CATEGORIES, START AUTHORIZATION AND AWARDS

In reference to the Inline Slalom World Skate rulebook the age categories, related start authorization and awards are as follows:

Children:

European Children Championship start authorization; at least eleven (11) and maximum fourteen (14) years old at 31st of December in the year of the competition. It is awarded "Inline Slalom Continental Children Champion".

Juniors:

European Juniors Championship start authorization; at least fifteen (15) and maximum eighteen (18) years old at 31st of December in the year of the competition. It is awarded "Inline Slalom Continental Juniors Champion".

Seniors:

European Seniors Championship start authorization; at least nineteen (19) and maximum thirty-nine (39) years old at 31st of December in the year of the competition. It is awarded "Inline Slalom European Seniors Champion".

Masters:

European Masters Championship start authorization; at least forty (40) years old at 31st of December in the year of the competition. It is awarded “Inline Slalom European Masters Champion”.

The European champions from last Championships have a fixed place in their discipline regardless of the quota system.

For the nation in which the organizer is based, the start rate increases by a total of 30 start-places for the organizer nation. All racers in both categories (female / male) who finished the first run of SL and GS according to valid rules can start in 2nd run without limit (the limit 40m-40w from World Cup is not applied).

Regarding awards presented to the athletes; places 1,2 and 3 receive medals. Any place from place 4 to 10 receive presents.

2.3 ORGANIZATIONAL RULES

The Championships are organized as follows (as decided in September 2023 by WSE Technical Commission):

- European Championships for (1) Children / Juniors respectively for (2) Seniors / Masters have to be jointly organized.
- European Championships for Children / Juniors are possible every year.
- European Championships for Seniors / Masters and thus also overall European Championships can be organized every second year.

European Championship cannot be organized and awarded during a WORLD SKATE-World Cup Race.



3. COMMUNICATION AND PROMOTION

The organizer has to use the official WSE logo for instance on start and result lists and during award ceremony and additional occasions related to sponsoring.

The organizer must provide live streaming on the whole track during the whole race. This live stream must be broadcasted via World Skate Europe TV.

The organizer has to define and name a responsible person for live streaming and a responsible person for taking professional photos during the Championships.

The organizer is responsible to get in touch with WSE Technical Commission (TC) and WSE communication department at least 3 weeks prior to the event to enable professional communication (i.e., streaming and photos etc.).

4. CANDIDATURE

For a candidature to be finally accepted, organizers have to comply with the (4.1) application deadline and the (4.2) requested payment of fees as well as with the (4.3) application dossier.

4.1 APPLICATION DEADLINE

Each National Federation interested in applying for the organization of European Championships must submit a written request within and not later than November 1 of the previous year for which the application is presented (example application deadline November 1, 2023 for Championships in 2024 season).

4.2 REQUESTED PAYMENT OF FEES

The organizing fee is 300€ for European Championships per discipline. The fees have to be paid to the bellow mentioned bank account.

The organizer can generate revenues from sponsors and athletes (cf. entry fee) to finance the organizing fee. Entry fee per racer per race is maximum 20€ (The entry fee is paid to the organizer).

All payments are due to World Skate Europe and must be made as follows:

- All payments are made in EUROS
- All payments must be made 14 days before the Event
- All payments are made by Bank Transfer only
- Bank Transfers are to be made without costs to World Skate Europe
- Bank Transfer Proof of payment **MUST** be sent to World Skate Europe by e-mail, to: europe@worldskate.org

5. RESPONSABILITIES AND RIGHTS OF WSE

WSE holds the rights of the championships, namely the television, marketing, merchandising, sponsorship and advertising rights.


WSE will do all in its power to ensure that the Championship is successfully carried out and that WSE is represented by competent persons, maintaining absolute impartiality. WSE is obliged to assist the Organiser with all means at its disposal.

6. SECURITY AND INSURANCE

The Organiser must implement all the security and public safety required by the host country law and regulations, guaranteeing:

- The presence, throughout the event, of a public or private security service (if necessary)
- The effective protection of the reserved area, protecting against problems that may occur with the public

Recommendation: The Organizer should contract an insurance and other guarantees, in particular regarding accidents that may occur with representatives of the teams, judges, institutional representatives, spectators and/or employees of the organization of the event.
