In Giant-Slalom the competitor is not allowed to go back and continue the race. <p>A general point. Is it really necessary, that all World Ranking or World Cup competitors have to repeat the run, when it starts raining? We suggest to add a rule, that really only the category has to be restarted, the best with the actual weather conditions will win. If a U16 has a dry street and a better time than a senior, who has wet conditions, then so what. It is to time consuming to let start all ladies or all men again. Also to dry the street with a flamethrower or wet the street with a water hose is time consuming and makes a race not really interesting for spectators live or on the TV. They want to see races not people drying the street.</p> <p>A general point: If the condition during the second run changes and it starts raining, the U10 categories do not have to restart. Their WR points will not count for this race. It can be decided by the parents, if they want to let start their child in this conditions.
